Students that can demonstrate their contributions and efforts to a healthier environment will be eligible for this award.

There are two STUDENT categories: K-12; and Higher Ed. Please indicate which category you are applying under. A winner will be chosen in each of the 2 categories.

The award winner/s will be contacted in advance, and the award will be presented to the student award winner at the **13**<sup>th</sup> **Annual Emerald Awards Gala** on October 30, 2015. For info on the Gala, <u>click here</u>. \$500 will be awarded to each winner.

Criteria, eligibility and award requirements are as follows:

## Award Criteria (students can choose one or more criteria)

Inspires or teaches others about sustainable practices.



- Connects Environmental Science or Education for Sustainability to the green building industry
- Demonstrates actions or strategies that help reduce the impact of Co2 emissions through innovative student designed projects or events.
- Demonstrates the economic and environmental value for sustainable design and construction of buildings
- Demonstrates leadership action steps that result in the conservation of materials and resources, behavioral or policy changes in a school or the community
- Promotes and educates about renewable energy sources, energy management strategies or energy efficiency practices

## **Eligibility:**

- Middle through High School Students in public or private schools.
- A student (or team of students) involved in an existing/on-going or a new project that
  satisfies one or more of the award criteria for the 2013- 2014 school year that can
  successfully demonstrate that the outcomes/results of the project have made a positive
  impact on the environment.

<u>Timeline:</u> Project submissions are being accepted now through **Wednesday, September 16, 2015.** 

## **Student Award Requirements:**

**1. Essay:** (30% of the project)

750 word description/essay that captures both the personal or collaborative efforts and motivations behind the project and also how this project will inspire and/or educate others.

**2. Project Details:** (70% of the project) (Presented in PDF format)

Project must include the following items:

- Name of project.
- Name of student(s).



- Project focus/category. Example, renewable energy, recycling, conservation, green advocacy, sustainability policy and strategic plan modifications at the district level, etc.
- Documentation of important action steps of the project that lead to a sustainable solution(s) including but not limited to, renderings, photographs or video. (Green Portfolio)
- Names of people, mentors, teachers, board members and organizations that participated and or provided support and resources for the project.
- Research sources and resources that assisted your project obtain its goal.
