- The NJSBA Task Force on Student Achievement presented six recommendations in its report

RECOMMENDATIONS

 CJJSI – Establish partnership & Cross system collaboration between education and Juvenile Justice Systems

 School Board – Development agreement with law enforcement addressing intersection of schools

RECOMMENDATION

 CJJSI – Encourage/Implement school policies/practices that establish discipline alternatives when dealing with disruptive students instead of out of school suspension, referrals & court.

 School Board – review consequences of disciplinary infractions.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- CJJSI Assist districts in implementing strategies that strengthen and streamline process for youth to return/enroll in school from placement
- School Board Literacy & functional skills programs for students with cognitive, behavioral or learning problems.
- Pre vocational & vocational employment opportunities in community.
