# **Voters Approve School Projects in 19 of 25 Districts**

**TRENTON**, **September 30**, **2009**—Voters in 19 school districts on Tuesday approved more than \$166 million in school construction, the New Jersey School Boards Association reported today.

In all, 25 districts proposed school-construction questions on Tuesday. Energy-saving initiatives were common, as many of the bond questions sought approval for new and more efficient windows, heating systems, or solar panels. Eight of the 25 questions asked for funding to install solar panels; voters approved all eight.

Of the \$166 million in construction that was approved, \$67.2 million will be eligible for state aid through one-time school-construction grants, annual "debt service aid" payments to school districts, or rebates through the state's Clean Energy program.

School boards may hold special elections on five specific dates a year. The next date on which a school board may schedule a bond referendum question is Dec. 8. Including Tuesday's vote, voters this year have approved school-construction proposals in 37 of 51 communities, for a success rate of nearly 73 percent. The average <u>success rate</u> of the previous four years has hovered around 62 percent.
